Course Objective:

In building construction class, the students will learn a variety of skills that will enhance and sharpen problem-solving abilities. The students will learn beginning and intermediate skills and knowledge in a safe working environment relating to:

- 1. Basic drafting and math related to shop
- 2. Machine and hand tool safety and proper tool usage
- 3. Construction of cabinets/projects
- 4. Cabinet theory and design
- 5. Plan of procedures
- 6. Assembly techniques

Class Policies:

- 1. For the safety of the students, safety glasses <u>must</u> be worn while students are in the shop.
- 2. Gum, candy, drinks, and food of any kind, Ipods, MP3 devices, cell phones, and electronic devices are NOT allowed in class or shop.
- 3. No unsafe acts, horseplay or goofing off will be allowed.
- 4. Students will allow the teacher to teach and fellow students to learn.
- 5. Everyone will respect the rights and property of others including considerate language.
- 6. Students will bring pencils, notebook, glasses, and the appropriate materials to class.
- 7. Students will be removed from the shop for any inappropriate behavior.
- 8. Students are not allowed to use the machinery without teacher permission.
- 9. Shelf space is provided for project storage during construction of projects. Lockers are available for students to store their personal items needed in the shop. Bring a lock from home. The school and its instructors are **not** responsible for misplaced or lost items.
- 10. Cell Phone Policy: Please refer to CHHS Code of Conduct and Student Handbook.
- 11. Student will not wear hats or long, loose, or baggy clothing including hoodies/jackets. These must be removed before entering the shop.

Consequences:

- 1. Verbal warning.
- 2. Write sentences/loss of shop privileges for 1 day.
- 3. Telephone call to parents or referral to notify parents.
- 4. Student/Parent Contract.
- 5. Referral to the vice-principal.

Rewards:

By following the rules of the class/shop, student will have a fun time in a safe and caring working environment.

Tardy Policy:

This class follows the school-wide tardy policy. Students will be in their assigned seat, quiet, and attentive when the bell rings. Attendance

Grading:

A student's grade is determined by a percentage of total points possible for the quarter. Grades include written assignments, tests, reports, projects, and participation points for each activity. Reflected items regarding participation is clean-up at the end of every period and respect given to projects made and machinery within the shop. Students will be involved in project evaluations.

When a student has an excused absence, they can make up the absence for work missed. This work must be turned in within one week of the day missed. If a student is in class and chooses not to do an assignment, that assignment cannot be made up.

Students may grade written assignments or read student's work in class.
